SUBJECT: Reopening of the Comment Period on Docket No. OSHA-2021-0009 to Allow for Submission of Documents and Comments

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify interested parties that the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) is reopening the comment period on Docket No. OSHA-2021-0009 to allow additional time for interested stakeholders to submit comments on its Small Business Advocacy Review (SBAR) Panel materials.

Comments on this docket will be accepted from 08/18/2023 to 12/23/2023. OSHA welcomes comments from all interested parties on the potential regulatory framework for a potential rule addressing heat injury and illness prevention in outdoor and indoor work settings, the alternatives and options that OSHA is considering, preliminary analysis of the unit costs of the framework, or any other aspect of the materials presented herein.
